

# **Crowthorne Baptist Church What's on – December 2025**



"Comfort ye, comfort ye my people, saith your God; speak comfortably to Jerusalem; and cry unto her, that her warfare is accomplished, that her iniquity is pardoned. The voice of him that crieth in the wilderness:- Prepare ye the way of the Lord: make straight in the desert a highway for our God."

Isaiah 40:1-3 (Authorised Version)

Some of my earliest memories of Advent and Christmas as a child involve that wonderful piece of music by Handel – his oratorio "*Messiah*". It was performed at Christmas by church choirs and choral societies in many towns in the North of England, where I grew up. My own church was no exception – we did some of the choruses (including the well-known "Hallelujah") at our Carol Service. Hearing the full thing, with top level soloists and the famous Hallé orchestra and choir in the Manchester Free Trade Hall was a real treat.

These verses from Isaiah form the opening of that great work. An important part of my Advent Sunday every year is sitting down to listen to Part 1 of "Messiah" on my well-loved CD. When I hear the Tenor soloist sing these words, it never fails to send a shiver down my spine.

As the world rushes forward to Christmas, with all the excesses of consumerism, we as Christians need to remember to take time to prepare in a different way. The season of Advent allows us to do that. The world is still a broken place, as it was when Jesus was born over 2,000 years ago. Many still long for comfort, for warfare to cease and for peace and justice to reign. God's answer was not a military or political leader, but a tiny baby who would grow into the suffering servant of Isaiah 53; the Saviour who would die on a cross to rescue us all from our biggest enemies – sin and death. The busy world of 1st Century Palestine didn't notice his coming, apart from a few chosen people. Let us look for him carefully and find him afresh through this season, perhaps through the LICC Advent Journey or another book.


