What's on – February 2026



“As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea – for they were fishers. And he said to them, ‘Follow me, and I will make you fishers of people.’ Immediately they left their nets and followed him.”
(**Matthew 4.18–20, NRSVue**)

When our Regional Minister, Hayley Young, came to preach in January, she took Luke 5:1-11 as her theme. The verses above are in Matthew’s account of the same story – the calling of the first disciples. Hayley encouraged us as a church to “go fishing” and seek to spread the good news about Jesus in our local community **now** – and not to wait till we have our new minister.

Just over a week after Hayley came, I read the verses from Matthew in a Bible Society “*Thought for the Day*” on Facebook. I took this as reinforcement of what Hayley had said. The article said that Jesus wasn’t just calling Peter and Andrew (and later James and John) to ‘tag along’ with him for a bit, but to leave their old way of life behind, to learn from him, follow his ways and be part of his mission. Three years later, after Jesus’s crucifixion and resurrection, his call on their lives remained the same: “*make disciples of all nations ... teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you*” (Matt 28:19–20). Perhaps Lent would be a good time for us all to reflect on what following Jesus looks like in our own lives. In what ways are we learning from him, following in his ways and taking part in his mission?

The disciples responded “immediately”. We might find this inspiring or challenging or both! Maybe each of us could ask the Holy Spirit to help us find out whether Jesus is calling us to leave something behind so that we can embrace the purpose he has for us, individually and as a church.

The Foodbank is located at the Vineyard Centre in Wellington Business Park and is open Mondays and Thursdays from 12 to 2pm. There is an additional session on Mondays from 5:30 to 7pm.

What is happening at the manse?

An important task during a pastoral vacancy is looking after the manse and making sure it is ready for the arrival of the next minister. Over the summer the maintenance team cleared things from the garden, ensured the garden was kept tidy and has identified things that need fixing. (You will be aware that the church has agreed to employ a contractor to repair the garage roof.)

Over recent weeks the focus has turned to internal decoration. We have removed all wallpaper and have started the internal painting. Already the internal doors and woodwork have been painted and the walls and ceilings on three bedrooms have been repainted. We've already used around 5 litres of gloss / satin paint and around 25 litres of emulsion!

By doing this work ourselves we save a lot of money for the church.

In the coming weeks we will have more painting to do, cleaning the rooms which are complete, general maintenance tasks and more work in the garden. We may decide to leave the painting of the lounge and main bedroom until we've appointed a new minister so that they can choose the colour scheme. **If you would like to help in any way, please speak to Richard Elsbury or Philip.**

Nomination paperwork will be available for members from Sunday 15th March.
